SIGNAGE APPROVAL!

A Dheinsville Settlement Signage Plan for 2009 was submitted and approved by the Village of Germantown Tourism/Betterment Fund! This signage plan project will help identify the complete Pre-Civil War town center which was built here in Germantown in the 1850's and still remains here today!

The State's "Discover Wisconsin" TV promotions will include The Bast Bell Museum in their new Washington County television program to be aired in April 2009. This will be a big boost to our Historic Settlement and, from many complaints we have received and calls for directional improvements for travelers. Our mapping systems are inadequate with Holy Hill Road to the east side of Hwy 41/45 not even shown on many maps, and no street directions.

A detailed plan of street signage is essential to take advantage of this marketing opportunity:

1. **Signs one mile out each direction from the six-way intersection.**
2. **Directional signs at Hwy 41/45 Exits.**
Holy Hill Road at exit - both sides of off ramps
Pioneer Road (Hwy 145) exit - both sides of off ramps
3. **Local signs at the entrance of "Dheinsville Historic Settlement":**
Philipp Wolf Log
Dhein Hotel
Germantown Insurance Co.
Dhein Farm
Bus entrance
Bar parking lot

We are also working on a new Walking Tour sign next to the Wolf Haus near parking. We would like to utilize our existing posts and apply a brick planter with flowers at the base. This brochures will have a dotted line indicating the path of our historic buildings and signs located in front of the historic buildings for people to follow their own self-guided tour of history. We are excited to be implementing this for visitors who come on the days we are closed.

HISTORY BOOK CELEBRATES 1ST YEAR!

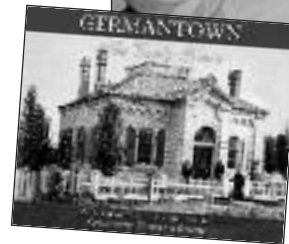
**We are now collecting photos for "20th century book".

Just one year ago (on a "frozen tundra Sunday") in January, we celebrated the enthusiastic reception of the first pre-sale orders of "Germantown - The Early Years" *Almost 400 of the limited edition of 500 have been sold!* We do not plan a second edition until after the "Book II - The 20th Century" is completed.

Bill Gay recently gave a short presentation at photo night at the Germantown library. We had a few attendees who purchased history books and we were able to scan a few photos. We will be doing more photo nights in the future so start gathering your photos.

Because of the success of the first volume of Germantown history, we plan to explore the 20th century (1900 - 1999 Germantown) with similar categories. Our plan is to take the story from the early 1900's, which the last volume barely touched, to the present, decade by decade. The Germantown area has significantly changed, still retaining much of its rural appeal, but emerging as a vibrant suburban community. It is that sense of community we hope to capture in this volume.
